NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at the next session thereof for the passing of an Act to amend Chapter 107 of the Acts of Assembly, 1913, by repealing Section three, which authorizes the Town of Bathurst to issue debentures in an amount not exceeding twenty thousand dollars; the borrowing powers under said section not having been used, and by adding a new section to said Act in lieu of the repealed section, authorizing the Town of Bathurst to make an issue of debentures to an amount not exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand dollars bearing interest at five per cent. per annum for the purpose of paying for installing water and sewerage systems in the Town of Bathurst and for all necessary plans, surveys, rights and rights of way and other expenses incidental to such installation and the sale and disposal of the debentures; and also to amend Section four of said Act by making the debentures redeemable in forty instead of twenty-five years.
