#### GEM THEATRES, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Seventeenth day of June, 1915, incorporating Stephen P. Gerow, Promoter; Herbert J. Anderson, Promoter; Frederick H. Trifts, Manager; G. Earle Logan, Barrister-at-Law, and J. To take over and acquire the business and plant of the Gem Theatre, in the City of Saint John;

To acquire, manage, operate and conduct music halls, opera houses, theatres and places of entertainment, to produce and provide for the production of opera, stage plays, dramas, comedies, burlesque performances, vaudeville performances, moving picture and theatrical performances of all kinds, and to carry on a general theatrical business

To manufacture moving picture machines and films and to do all things necessary and incidental thereto;

To conduct and operate a moving picture film exchange; by the name of "Gem Theatres, Limited," with a total capital stock of six thousand dollars, divided into six hundred shares of ten dollars each, and with the head office at the City of Saint John, in said Province.

### APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT

#### THE FIVE FINGERS LUMBER COMPANY, LIMITED.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may be hereafter set forth, that is to say:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Five Fingers Lumber Company, Limited," which is not the name of any other Company known to the applicants, or liable to be confounded therewith, or otherwise on public grounds objectionable.

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To carry on in the Province of New Brunswick a general business in lumbering and in the purchase, sale and manufacturing of lumber and the products of lumber.

(b) To build, erect, equip, maintain, purchase, operate, sell, take on lease or otherwise acquire or dispose of saw mills, shingle mills, lath mills, box mills and other mills for the manufacture of wood and wood products in the Province of New Brunswick.

(c) To purchase, take on lease or license from the Crown or any person or persons, company or companies, and take by assignment or transfer leases or licenses granted by the Crown or by any person or persons, company or companies, or otherwise acquire timber lots, timber limits and rights to cut timber in the Province of New Brunswick, and to operate and to sell or otherwise get the same to market or to places of manufacturing, and to sell, manufacture and otherwise dispose of the same.

(d) To manufacture, buy, sell, transport or otherwise deal or trade in deal planks, boards, shingles, laths and other kinds of sawn lumber and other goods and articles of all kinds in the manufacture of which lumber or wood is used.

(e) To carry on the business of merchants and general storekeepers, and to do a general mercantile business, and to sell, buy, purchase, trade in, barter or otherwise deal in goods, wares or merchandise and to buy, sell, trade in and barter in other things capable of being used in connection with lumbering operations or the operation of saw mills or other mills for manufacturing any or all products of wood, or required by workmen and others employed by the company.

(f) To purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire water rights, water powers, electric power, and to generate water power or electrical power and electric light, and to sell or otherwise dispose of any or all of the same.

(g) For all or any of the purposes aforesaid, to purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire lands, tenements and hereditaments in the Province of New Brunswick, and to construct, make, manufacture, purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire, maintain and operate tramways, railways, machine shops and warehouses or other buildings for the storage of goods, wares, merchandise and provisions, lumber yards, railway sidings, piers, booms, cranes, hoisting gear and other articles and facilities for loading and discharging vessels and scows and all materials, articles, tools, engines, boilers, tackle, apparel, furniture and machinery of all kinds.

(h) To issue fully paid-up shares, bonds or debentures of the Company in payment or part payment of the purchase price of any property, real or personal, franchise, patent or other right, business or good-will thereof, acquired by the Company, or in payment of any purchase of the bonds, stock, property or assets of any other Company having objects similar to those of the Company.

(i) To obtain from any government, or from any potentate, local or other authority, any monopolies, concessions, charges, contracts, franchises, grants, privileges and rights, the acquisition or possession of which may appear likely to further the objects or benefit the company, and to account any grants, contracts or rights so obtained.

(j) To pay for any services rendered to and any property or rights acquired by the Company, in such manner as may seem expedient, and in particular by the issue of shares or securities of the Company, credited as fully or partly paid up.

(k) To sell, pledge, hypothecate, mortgage, lease, let or
