RULES AND PRACTICE OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

Private Bills.

78. A typewritten copy or printed copy of every Private Bill or Local Bill introduced into this House shall be filed with the Clerk of the House within ten days after the opening of the Session, and in case of failure to comply with this pro-vision the fee on the introduction of any such Private Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Rule 84, applicable to such Bill, and Local Bills introduced after ten days of the opening of the Session shall pay the same fee as a Private Bill.

No Private Bill, or Bill making any amendments of a like nature to a former Act, shall be received by the House unless a notice specifying clearly and distinctly the nature and objects thereof, has been published four successive weeks previous to the meeting of the Legislature, or to the introduc-tion of the Bill, in some one of the newspapers published in the County interested in or to be affected by the measure, or in the locality where the parties affected, or the majority of them reside; and when no newspaper jublished in such nearest adjoining County in which a newspaper is published, and also in the Royal Gazette. When the County or City in-terested in the measure or the locality in which the parties affected reside, is largely composed of a French population, then such noitce shall also be published in a French news-paper, if any be published in the Province. 80. In any County where no newspaper may be published, the Bill, in lieu of other local publication, may be read at the Assizes in the presence of the Grand Jury, or before the Muni-cipal Council of the County interested in or affected upon or attached to the said Bill by the Clerk of the Court, or the Town Clerk, or the Secretary Treasurer, as the case may be, verified by the seal (if any) of the Court, Town Council or Municipal Council, as the case may be; and Separate Petitions may be presented to the House, setting forth in detail the ob-jets adoption. 81. It shall be the duty of all parties seeking the inter-
