PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the first day of June, A. D. 1915, incorporating Samuel W. Dimock, Theatre Manager; Daniel E. Richards, Lumberman; Reginald K. Shives, Insurance Agent; George St. Onge, Merchant, and Hugh A. Carr, Barrister-at-Law; all of the Town of Campbellton, in the County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase or otherwise acquire, manage, operate, conduct and dispose of opera houses, moving picture theatres, skating rinks and places of entertainment in the Towns of Campbellton and Dalhousie and at Athol in the Parish of Addington, in the County of Restigouche; also to produce and provide for the production of opera, stage plays, dramas, comedies, burlesque performances, vaudeville performances, moving pictures and other theatrical performances and representations, and generally to carry on a general amusement and theatrical business.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and dispose of dramatic copyrights and to accept and grant licenses for representations of all kinds.

To acquire, carry on and dispose of any other business which the Company may deem suitable or expedient to be carried on or in any way connected with the business hereby authorized to be carried on or which may be incidental thereto, by the name of "Dimock Amusement Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into four thousand nine hundred shares of ten dollars each, and with the head office at the Town of Campbellton in the County of Restigouche in said Province.
