NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at the next session thereof, for the passing of an Act to amend Section One of Chapter 82 of Acts of Assembly of New Brunswick, 1910, by striking out the words "Six Thousand Dollars" in the seventh line thereof, and substituting in lieu thereof the words "Eleven Thousand Dollars, in any one year," which will thus enable the Municipality to procure temporary loans in all amounts to Twenty-five thousand dollars, in any one year, and that a section be added to such amending Act authorizing the Municipality of Gloucester to vote and pay the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to the Patriotic Fund, and the further sum of Five Hundred Dollars to the Belgian Fund, and that the same be assessed upon the Municipality and collected in the same manner and at the same time and as part of the money assessed for county contingency purposes, and that the resolution of the Municipal Council of Gloucester adopted on the eighteenth day of January last past directing the assessing and payment of such sums, be declared, by such Act, to be lawfully voted, and as if the same had been voted under the authority of such proposed Act.
