NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the great seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the Joint Stock Companies' Act of the Province of New Brunswick, and Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, to incorporate and constitute the applicants and such other persons who may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the said Company is "CARSON REAL ESTATE COMPANY, LIMITED."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To carry on the business of a real estate company and for such purposes to buy, sell, lease, and generally deal in lands, houses, cottages, shops, offices, hotels and other buildings and real estate of all kinds in this Province and elsewhere; to erect, build and maintain buildings, cottages, on such lands and premises and make other improvements with full powers to lease, mortgage, sell or otherwise deal in the same or any part thereof; to act as agents for persons owning or interested in real estate of all kinds or in leasehold property or both; to borrow money upon the credit of the company or upon the securities of its property or any part thereof; to issue bonds, debentures or other securities for the lawful purposes of the company and to pledge or sell the same for such sums and prices as may be deemed expedient or be necessary and to hypothecate any or all such bonds, debentures or other securities.

(b) To construct, maintain, improve, manage, work, and control any factories, warehouses, shops and houses and other conveniences which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to or convenient for any of the objects of the Company.

(c) To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business properties and liabilities of any company carrying on any business which the company is authorized to carry on or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this company, and to pay therefor in fully paid up or partly paid up shares of the company or in the bonds, debentures or other securities of the company.

(d) To sell, dispose of or lease or otherwise deal with or dispose of the whole or any part of the property, assets or undertaking of the company as a going concern or otherwise, for such consideration as the company may think fit, and in particular, shares, bonds, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this company.
