The area proposed to be included in the scheme comprises all the land within the boundaries of the City of Saint John which is unbuild upon, or only partially developed, also portions of the Parishes of Simonds and Lancaster, in the County of Saint John, within a radius varying from three to five miles approximately from the centre of the city, which area has been delineated, and is shown upon a Map marked and known as Map No. 1, prepared in accordance with the town planning regulations prescribed by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, which said map has been deposited at the office of the Common Clerk, and may there be inspected by any person interested without payment of any fee, between the hours of ten and twelve in the forenoon of any week-day, and two and five in the afternoon of any week-day except Saturday during one calendar month next following the first publication hereof; and provision has been made for affording any person interested, any necessary explanation with reference to the said map.
