

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday, the twenty-second day of July instant, I have thought fit to further prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday, the second day of September next.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the twenty-first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.

THE HONOURABLE THE PROVINCIAL SECRETARY-TREASURER REPORTS FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL:

That on the Ninth day of June last past, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council under and by virtue of Section four of the Acts of the Legislative Assembly, 5 George V., Chapter 9, by Order-in-Council determined the time within which the Saint John and Quebec Railway Company might make arrangements satisfactory to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for the completion of the Saint John Valley Railway to be within twenty days from the said ninth day of June last past, of which time the said Company had due notice; that the said Company has not made satisfactory arrangements for the completion of said line of railway as required by said Order-in-Council and notice thereof so as aforesaid given;

The Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, in consequence of such arrangements not having been made and in-pursuance of the provisions of said section four of said Chapter 9 of said Act, 5 George V., now recommends that all the shares of the capital stock of the said Company issued prior to the date of the publication of this Order vest in His Majesty on behalf of the Province, free from all liens, pledges, charges or other encumbrances, except the lien in favour of the Prudential

Trust Company Limited, as presently existing in respect to 19749 shares, with power to transfer the said shares, or any of them, to such persons as may from time to time be designated by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council to be held by them in trust for the Province, with all such further and other powers in respect to such shares as are given by said Act.

The Provincial Secretary-Treasurer further recommends that the present directors and officers of the said Company be disseized of their said offices and that the following named persons to be the directors and officers of the said Company in place of the directors and officers of said Company disseized by virtue of this Order, to hold office until the general meeting of the said Company to be called as provided by said Act, shall be held, namely:

Irving R. Todd, of the Town of St. Stephen, Merchant, President.

Edouard Grouard, of the City of Moncton, Barrister-at-Law, Secretary.

John D. Palmer, of the City of Fredericton, Manufacturer, Treasurer.

William Shives Fisher, of the City of St. John, Merchant, and Richard O'Leary, of the Town of Richibucto, Merchant.

The Provincial Secretary-Treasurer further recommends that this Order-in-Council be published in the "Royal Gazette" as required by law.

And the Committee of the Executive Council concurring in the several recommendations of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, IT IS ACCORDINGLY SO ORDERED.
