

(e) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects, and to do all or any of the above mentioned objects as principals, agents, conductors, trustees, or otherwise, and by or through travellers, agents or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others.

(f) To pay out of the funds of the Company all expenses incidental to the incorporation and organization of the Company.

(g) To remunerate any person or company for services rendered or to be rendered in placing or assisting to place or guaranteeing the placing of any of the shares in the company's capital, or any debentures or other securities of the company, or in or about the formation of the Company or the conduct of the Company's business.

(h) To distribute in specie or otherwise among the shareholders of the company any assets of the Company, and particularly the shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of any other company that may purchase or assume the whole or any part of the assets or liabilities of the company.

(i) The company may from time to time, pursuant to by-law passed for that purpose, and ratified by a meeting of the Company to be advisable or necessary in carrying on the business of the Company, or in exercising the powers hereinbefore mentioned, or any of them.
