

APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT

ROBINSON LIMITED.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company a body politic and corporate under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "Robinson Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought and the powers of the Company shall be as follows:

(a) To carry on and operate a general lumber business in all its branches.

(b) To carry on and conduct a general trading and mercantile business both wholesale and retail.

(c) For the purposes of its business, to build, purchase, charter, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and use real and personal property of all kinds, with power to sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the same, or the undertakings of the Company, or any part thereof.

(d) To acquire the goodwill, real and personal property, rights and assets, or any part thereof, and assume the liabilities or any part thereof of any person, firm or Company carrying on or transacting any business similar to that conducted by the Company, and to pay for the same in cash or in securities or shares of the Company, or otherwise.

(e) To secure by original subscription, or to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares and securities in any other Company authorized to do any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

(f) To procure license to be registered in any country or state, and to apply therefor to any government or authority, whether Federal, Provincial, Municipal, Local or otherwise.

(g) To do all and everything necessary, incidental, suitable, convenient or proper for the carrying on of the said business or the accomplishment of any purpose or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Company either as carrying on the said business or any part thereof or as holder of or as interested in any property or otherwise.

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APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT

"THE TOBIQUE LUMBER COMPANY, LIMITED."

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, in Council, for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the great seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed Company a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Tobique Lumber Company, Limited."

The objects for which the proposed incorporation is sought are as follows:

1. To purchase, acquire and take over the lumber, milling and general business at Tobique in the Parish of Addington, and Eel River, in the Parish of Dalhousie, all in the County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick, at present carried on by Havelock Sansom, doing business under the name and style of "Havelock Sansom," with headquarters at the Town of Campbellton in the County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick, and all stock, assets, warehouses, wharves, buildings, real estate, leases, personal property rights and credits of the said business carried on under the name of "Havelock Sansom," and to pay for the same in paid up stock of the Company to be incorporated.

2. To carry on a general lumber business in all its branches including the logging, driving, sawing, manufacturing and shipping of lumber of every kind and description and the buying, selling and dealing in lumber of every kind, both manufactured and unmanufactured, both wholesale and retail.

3. To acquire, maintain and erect saw mills and operate same for the sawing and manufacturing of lumber of all kinds and converting and manufacturing wood into pulp.

4. To carry on a general wholesale and retail store business in goods, wares and merchandise of every kind.

5. To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise own, hold, and possess in fee simple or otherwise, lands, grants, licenses and lumber lands, lumber rights, options, mills, mill privileges, milling business, waterways and rights, buildings, plant, machinery, vessels, tugs, scows, booms, dams, driving rights and franchises and such other real and personal property as

may from time to time be acquired or deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes of or incident to the business aforesaid or any part of it.

6. To acquire, undertake and take over any part of the business, property or liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business which the Company is authorized to carry on or possess all property suitable for the operation of the Company.
