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NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at the next session thereof for the passing of an Act to amend Chapter 54 of the Acts of Assembly, 1914, by striking out the word "fifteen" in the second line of the fifth paragraph thereof and substituting the word "thirty" therefor, thereby making the period wherein the total annual valuation to be placed upon all pulp and paper mills and additional buildings of the plant and equipment of Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited, con-

nected therewith, and lands upon which the same are erected, in the Town of Bathurst, shall not exceed, for all taxation purposes, the sum of one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars, and in County valuation, shall not exceed one hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars, for a period of thirty years from the passing of said Act, instead of fifteen years; and also to extend the southern boundaries of the Town to the south side instead of the north side of DeMeresq Street, and to include within the Town limits a piece of land beginning at the westerly side of the southern end of Murray Street, thence on a prolongation thereof southerly five hundred and three feet or to a point being a prolongation westerly of the southern side of the Main Highway immediately west of the iron bridge over Nepisquit River, thence following said prolongation easterly eighty feet to lands of Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited, thence northerly along said lands to DeMeresq Street, thence westerly to the prolongation of westerly side of Murray Street, and the right to lay out a street thereon.
