To provide a Club House, grounds and other conveniences in connection therewith for the use and recreation of mem-bers of the Club, at or near the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

To buy, sell and deal in all kinds of apparatus and pro-visions required by persons frequenting the Club's premises.

To purchase, take on Lease, or otherwise acquire any lands, buildings, easements, or property, real and personal, which may be requisite for the purposes of or capable of being conveniently used in connection with any of the objects of the Club, and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of such property. To promote in any way the recreation, and the mutual improvement and pleasure thereby of the members of the Club. The name of the Club shall be "The Crescent Lake Club,"

with a total Capital Stock of Two thousand one hundred dol-lars, divided into Twenty-One shares of One hundred dollars each, and with the head office at the City of Saint John, in said Province.

The shares of the capital stock shall not be transferable to any persons not then being a member of and shareholder in the Club, until the name of the proposed transferee or member has been first submitted for the approval of the existing shareholders or members, or as may be prescribed by the bye-laws of the Club.
