An Act to amend "The Fire Insurance Policies Act," 3 George V., Chapter 26.

An Act to amend the Act 5, George V., Chapter 10, intitled "An Act to authorize City, Town or Municipal Councils to make contributions to the Canadian Patriotic Fund and other funds, and to validate those already made."

An Act to amend "The Judicature Act, 1909."

An Act to amend Chapter 169 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, respecting the registration of Provincial Debentures.

An Act to amend "An Act for the Suppression of Infectious and Contagious Diseases Among Bees, and for the Protection of Bees," 5 George V., Chapter 19.

An Act to amend "An Act to Provide for the Inspection and Registration of Stallions," 5 George V., Chapter 18.

An Act to confirm a Grant to "The Canadian Patriotic Fund."

An Act to provide for the granting of land to certain persons who are serving His Majesty in the present war.

An Act to authorize the Town of Saint John to issue Debentures.

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
