

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT

"E. Burt Lumber Company, Limited."

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916," Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the said Province, bearing date the first day of December, A. D. 1916, incorporating Elwood Burt, Lumberman; Roy E. Burt, Merchant; and Sheldon Howland, Accountant, all of the Parish of Douglas, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over the lumber business heretofore carried on by Elwood Burt at Burt's Corner, in the Parish of Douglas, in the County of York, as a going concern, and generally to carry on and operate a general lumber business in all its branches, including the logging, driving, sawing, manufacturing, shipping and selling of lumber and lumber products of every description and kind, pulpwood, and the buying, selling and dealing in lumber and lumber products of every kind, manufactured and unmanufactured, both wholesale and retail, and to acquire, erect and maintain mills and operate the same for the sawing and manufacturing of lumber of all kinds.

To purchase, deal in and sell either wholesale or retail, all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise necessary for the carrying on of a general merchandise business.

To build, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, own, hold and possess in fee simple or otherwise lands, grants, licenses, lumber lands, lumber rights, options, mills, mill privileges, mill business and rights, stores, dwelling houses, warehouses, machine shops, blacksmith shops, waterways and rights, buildings, plant and machinery, scows, barges, wharves, tugs, vessels, marine slips, booms, dams, driving rights, driving privileges and franchises and such other real and personal property as may from time to time be acquired or deemed necessary for all or any part of the purposes of or incident to the business aforesaid or any part of the same, with power, from time to time, to make, pledge, hypothecate or encumber the same or any part thereof, and from time to time to dispose of any or all of the real estate and personal property of the Company at pleasure, and to do any and all things considered necessary for the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is sought as aforesaid.

By the name of "E. Burt Lumber Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of twenty thousand dollars, divided into two hundred shares of one hundred dollars each, and with the head office at Burt's Corner, in the Parish of Douglas, in the County of York in said Province.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916," Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the first day of December, A. D. 1916, incorporating George E. Fisher, Howard M. Leonard, Thomas P. Hetherington, Judson E. Hetherington, and George A. Gamblin, all of the Parish of Johnston, in the County of Queen's and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To maintain and manage all that certain piece or parcel of land situate and lying on the southeast side of the Washademoak Lake, in the Parish of Johnston, in the County of Queen's and Province of New Brunswick, being the corner formed by the road leading from the English Settlement meeting the road leading up and down the Washademoak Lake aforesaid and a part of lot number eight, the same running easterly along said English Settlement road fifty-five feet, turning northerly and running parallel with road leading up and down the Washademoak Lake forty feet, turning westerly and running parallel with the English Settlement road fifty-five feet until it strikes road running up and down the said Washademoak Lake, and following said road in a southerly direction forty feet to the place of beginning, containing two thousand and two hundred square feet; together with the buildings and erections thereon (which last mentioned land and buildings is now in the name of the within applicants as Trustees of the Public Hall of the said Parish of Johnston).
