To do all or any of the above things hereby authorized as principals, agents, contractors, vendors, or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others and to do all said things, and any such other things as may seem directly or indirectly to be incidental or conducive to or proper or convenient for the accomplishment of the purposes or the attainment of the objects of the Company or any of them or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Company or its property.

No object, purpose or power stated, given or granted in any paragraph hereof shall be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph hereof. By the name of "Dominion Tanneries, Limited," with a total capital stock of Two hundred thousand dollars, divided into Two thousand shares of One hundred dollars each, and with the head office at the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, with permission to hold the annual meetings of the Company, and also special meetings of the shareholders and directors without the Province of New Brunswick and within the United States of America or elsewhere, from time to the United States of America or elsewhere, from time to time, in accordance with by-laws therefor to be made from time to time by the Company.
