To purchase, own, lease or otherwise acquire and hold any patent or patent rights or other rights and utilize to sell, let or dispose of the same.

To pay for any real or personal property or rights acquired for the use of the Company with capital stock of the Company which when issued for such purpose shall be deemed to be and pass as fully paid-up stock.

To purchase, hire or construct for use in connection with any business of the Company, buildings, storage depots, wharves, vessels, barges, tramways, cars, motor vehicles or other conveyances.

To enter into an agreement with any railway company or companies for the construction, use and operation of a spur or siding or line of railway connecting the mines of the said company with any line of railway.

To do any and all things which are incidental or necessary to the carrying out of the aforesaid objects or which in the opinion of the Directors of the said Company may be usefully carried on in connection with any business of the Company hereinbefore authorized.
