And in the event of the petition being adopted by the electors, the Governor General in Council may at any time after the expiration of thirty days from the day on which the same was adopted, by Order in Council published in the Canada Gazette, declare that Part II of the said Act shall no longer be in force and thereafter Part II shall cease to be in force or effect in the said County of Sunbury.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
