NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the Town of Bathurst, to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at its next session, for the passing of an Act.

1. To close, and vest in Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited, in fee simple, that part of Old Miramichi Road, in the Town of Bathurst, from a point four hundred and twenty feet northerly from its junction with the Caraque Highway, and from thence northerly to the shore of the Harbor, and also the ferry landing road extending from a point on the northerly side of said portion of said road about eight chains from the end thereof, and from thence westerly to the harbor of Bathurst.

2. To authorize the Town of Bathurst to make an issue of debentures in an amount not exceeding seventy-four thousand dollars, par value, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable half yearly, said debentures to be payable forty years after date, for the following purposes: \$21,000 for required extensions to water and sewerage systems, and additional plant and work on said systems; \$13,000 being amount necessary to pay balance due for present work done

on the water and sewerage systems; \$30,000 for the erection of Town Building, for Town Hall, police office, fire engine house, and other purposes of the Town; and \$10,000 for permanent sidewalks.

3. To allow the Town Council, every year, to borrow, temporarily, or until the rates and taxes are collected in each year, a sum or sums of money not exceeding in all the sum of ten thousand dollars, to be repaid within the period of one year as soon as the taxes are collected, in lieu of the borrowing powers given by sub-section (2) Section 71 of the Towns Incorporation Act.
