RULES AND PRACTICE OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

Private and Local Bills.

77. A typewritten copy or printed copy of every Private Bill or Local Bill introduced into this House shall be filed with the Clerk of the House within ten days after the opening of the Session, and in-case of failure to comply with this pro-vision the fee on the introduction of any such Private Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Rule 54 applicable to such Bill, and Local Bills introduced after ten days of the opening of the Session shall pay the same fee as a Private Bill.

Bill. 78. No Private Bill, or Bill making an amendment of a like nature to a former Act, shall be received by the House, unless a notice, specifying clearly and distinctly the nature and objects thereof, has been published four successive weeks previous to the meeting of the Legislature, or to the introduc-tion of the Bill, in some one of the newspapers published in the County interested in or to be affected by the measure, or in the locality where the parties affected, or the majority of them reside; and when no newspaper is published in such County or locality, then in some newspaper having general direulation in such County or locality, and also in the Royal Gazette. When the City or County interested in the measure, or the locality in which the parties affected reside, is largely composed of a French population, then such notice shall also be published in a French newspaper, if any be published in the Province. 75. In any County where no newspaper may be published.

the Province. 79. In any County where no newspaper may be published, the Bill, in lieu of other local publication, may be read at any Circuit or County Court in the presence of the Grand Jury. or before the Municipal Council of the County interested in or affected by the Bill; and a certificate of such reading shall be indorsed thereon, or attached to the said Bill, by the Cierk of the Court, or the Town Cierk, or the Secretary-Treasurer. as the case may be, verified by the Seal (if any) of the Court. Town Council or Municipal Council, as the case may be; and separate Petitions must be presented to the House, setting forth in detail the object of the measure, and the reasons that may be urged for its adoption.

On Bills for the Incorporation of Companies having a stated capital, the same fee to be paid according to the amount of capital authorized as are imposed under the N. B. Joint Stock Companies Act, together with a fee for each page of the Bill exceeding five, of \$10.00. To Bills in amendment of such Acts, one-third of the original fee, except when the capital is not increased nor powers extended, in which cases the same fee shall be paid as on Bills amending Acts for Incorporating Companies not having a stated capital. A page, for the purposes of this Rule, shall mean, not exceeding 500 words. Provided, that where a Bill in respect of which such the payment has been made, does not pass the Legislature, it is introduced at the next following Session, upon the payment of an additional sum of \$10.00; and Provided, that where the Rule shall not extend to Acts for the incorporation or relating to the property or objects of the incorporation of publication of Bills advertised under Rule for the Rules and Practice of this House must be by afficient or solemn declaration.
