PROCLAMATION

By His Honour William Pugsley, D. C. L., LL. D., K. C.,
P. C., Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New
Brunswick:

Whereas, it has been officially announced that an Armistice has been agreed to by the Commander-in-Chief of the Allied and American Forces, and the Envoys of the German Government, under which hostilities have now ceased, pending negotiations for peace, and it is fitting that the people of New Brunswick should mark their appreciation of this great event which it is believed will lead to the making of a satisfactory and enduring peace,

The people of this Province are hereby requested to observe Tuesday, the 12th day of November instant, as a public holiday, and as a day for general thanksgiving for the splendid and overwhelming victories achieved by the Allied and American forces, and for the cessation of hostilities, under circumstances which will secure upon an enduring basis those ideals for which they have so long been bravely fighting, and mark the triumph of democracy and liberty throughout the civilized world.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the
11th day of November, in the year of our Lord
one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and
in the ninth year of His Majesty's reign.
