

hire and lease all kinds of steam and sailing vessels, boats, tugs and barges and other vessels, wharves, docks, elevators, warehouses, freight sheds and other buildings necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Company.

To acquire by purchase, lease, hire, exchange, or otherwise any rights or privileges which may be necessary or useful for the carrying on of the business of the Company.

To apply for and maintain, register, lease, acquire and hold, or to sell, lease and dispose of and grant licenses in respect of or otherwise turn to account any patents of invention, improvements or processes, trade-marks, trade names and the like, necessary or useful for any of the purposes of the Company.

To lease, sell, improve, manufacture, develop, exchange, turn to account, or otherwise dispose of any or all of the properties and assets of the Company for such consideration as the Company deem fit, including shares, debentures or securities of any other Company.

To purchase all or any part, including the good-will of the business or undertaking, or the property or assets, privileges, contracts, rights, obligations, and liabilities of any Company, person or persons carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or any business similar thereto, or possessing any property suitable for the purposes thereof, and to pay for the same wholly or in part in Bonds, Debentures or fully paid and non-assessable stock of the Company, and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the same, or any part thereof.

To enter into any arrangement for sharing of profits, union of interest, co-operation, joint adventure, reciprocal concession or otherwise, with any person or Company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on any business or transaction which this Company is authorized to engage in or carry on or to amalgamate with any such Company.

To acquire by purchase, concession, exchange or other legal title, the good will, property, rights and assets, and assume the liabilities of any person, firm or Company, transacting any business similar to that conducted by this Company, together with the buildings, stock-in-trade, and assets generally in such business, and to purchase, acquire and hold the stock or shares of stock in any other Corporation carrying on business similar to that which this Company is hereby authorized to carry on, notwithstanding the provisions of "The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916".

To raise and assist in raising money for and to aid by way of bonus, loan, promise, endorsement, guarantee of Bonds, Debentures or other securities or otherwise any other Company or Corporation and to guarantee the forms of contract by any such Company or Corporation, or by any other person or persons with whom the Company may have business relations.

To invest the moneys of the Company not immediately required in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

To distribute among the shareholders of the Company in kind any property of the Company and in particular any shares, debentures, or securities in any other Companies belonging to the Company or which the Company may have power to dispose of.

To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.

To lend moneys to customers and others having dealings with the Company and to guarantee the performance of contracts by any such persons.

To sell or dispose of the undertakings of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, bailees, contractors, trustees or otherwise, and whether alone or in conjunction with others.

To pass a bye-law under the Provisions of Section 74, New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, making the Company a close Corporation, and that the shares of the Capital Stock shall not be transferable to any person not being a Shareholder at the time such transfer is proposed to be made.

The powers in each paragraph to be in no wise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other paragraph.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects; by the name of "Steen Bros., Limited", with a total Capital Stock of Forty Nine Thousand Dollars divided into Four Hundred and Ninety Shares of One Hundred Dollars each, and with the head office at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.
