

## PARLIAMENT OF CANADA

CONDENSED RULES RESPECTING NOTICES FOR  
PRIVATE BILLS.

**A**LL applications to Parliament for Private Bills shall be advertised by a notice in the Canada Gazette clearly and distinctly stating the nature and objects of the application, and signed by or on behalf of the applicants, with the address of the party signing the same. For an Act of Incorporation the name of the proposed company shall be stated. If the works of any company are to be declared to be for the general advantage of Canada, the same shall be specifically mentioned in the notice, and a copy of such notice shall be sent by registered letter to the clerk of each county or municipality which may be specially affected by such works, and also to the Secretary of the Province in which such works are or may be located; and proof of such service of notice shall be established by statutory declaration.

In addition to the notice in the Canada Gazette aforesaid, a similar notice shall be published in some leading newspaper, as follows:

## 1. For Acts of Incorporation—

(a) Of a railway or canal company, or of a company for the construction of any special works, or for obtaining any special rights and privileges. In the principal place in each county or district affected.

(b) Of a telegraph or telephone company. In the principal place in each province in which the company intends to operate.

(c) Of banks, insurance, trust, loan or industrial companies (without any special powers): Advertise in the Canada Gazette only.

## 2. For Amendments to Acts of Incorporation—

(a) For the extension of a line of railway or canal, or branches thereto: In the principal place in each county affected.

(b) For the revival or continuation of a charter, or for extension of time for the construction of works of any kind, or for the enlargement of any of the powers of a company (not involving additional special powers): At the head office of the company.

(c) For the granting of any special powers or privileges: In the localities actually affected.

All such notices shall be published at least once a week for five consecutive weeks; and in Quebec and Manitoba shall be published in both English and French; and if there be no newspaper published in the locality affected, such notices shall be given in the next nearest locality wherein a newspaper is published. Proof of publication shall be established in each case by statutory declaration to be sent to the Clerk of the House.

## THE MADAWASKA LUMBER COMPANY, LIMITED.

To act as general merchants in connection with the matters aforesaid or any of them.

To generate electrical or other power, and use, lease, sell or otherwise dispose of the same.

To acquire, hold and dispose of timber licenses granted or conceded or leased by the Crown.

To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange or otherwise, lands, buildings and hereditaments of any nature or description, whether situate in the Province of New Brunswick or elsewhere, and to sell, exchange, mortgage or otherwise encumber or dispose of and turn to account as may seem expedient, upon such terms as may be desirable, the whole or any portion of such lands and all or any buildings or structures that are now or may hereafter be erected thereon, and to erect, alter, repair and maintain buildings upon such lands in which the Company may have any interest.

To acquire by purchase, exchange or otherwise, and to sell, transfer or dispose of personal property of any nature whatsoever, by the name of "The Madawaska Lumber Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of ten thousand dollars, divided into one hundred shares of one hundred dollars each, and with the Head Office at the Town of Edmundston, in the County of Madawaska, in the said Province.

To purchase, sell, lease or otherwise acquire coal areas, coal, mining leases, licenses and rights to search for coal, and to mine and deal in coal in all its branches.

To purchase, construct, use, lease and dispose of wharves, docks, trams, tramways, coal pockets, chutes, warehouses or other facilities necessary for and incidental to the business and undertakings herein.

To purchase, operate, sell, lease or otherwise obtain or dispose of mills, machinery and all other kinds of personal property necessary for or incidental to the manufacture of logs and lumber, and in any way incidental to the within mentioned business and undertakings.

To purchase, sell and deal in merchandise of all kinds in connection with the business and undertakings herein mentioned.
