PROCLAMATION.

UNDER and by virtue of Section 79 of the Acts of the Legislative Assembly, 8 George V., 1918, Chapter 37, intituled "An Act to provide for Compensation to Workmen for Injuries Sustained and Industrial Diseases Contracted in the Course of Their Employment," and by an Order-in-Council thereunder made, and pursuant to the power and authority thereby in me vested, I do order and declare that the provisions of Part I of the said Act relating to the organization of "Workmen's Compensation Board," the classification of industries and the levying and collecting of assessments, as provided by section 79 of the said Act, shall come into force on, from and after the 18th day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.
