HIS HONOUR the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Rules and Regulations:

That in addition to the Rules and Regulations passed by Order-in-Council governing the collection of the Amusement Tax, the following regulation be passed:

"No entertainment of whatever sort or description to which an admission fee is charged and the proceeds of which are not wholly for patriotic purposes, shall be held without a permit allowing the said entertainment to be held, and providing at the same time for a supply of amusement tax tickets necessary in connection therewith. If such entertainment is held without a permit from the Amusement Tax Inspector, the promoters of the same shall be liable to the penalties provided for in the 11th section of the Theatres and Cinematographs Act."

THE Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer reports for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That certain cities, towns, municipalities and school districts in the Province of New Brunswick have sinking funds to their credit in certain chartered banks; that the said cities, towns, municipalities and school districts are desirous of investing said sinking funds in Victory Loan Bonds, but may not have sufficient authority to withdraw such funds for investment in said bonds:

The Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer now recommends that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor undertake to promote legislation at the next session of the Legislative Assembly ratifying and confirming any investments made by said cities, towns, municipalities and school districts of their sinking funds in said Victory Loan Bonds, and granting power to said cities, towns, municipalities and school districts to subscribe for such bonds, said bonds to be registered.

And His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor and the Committee of Council concurring in the said report and recommendation, it is accordingly so ordered.
