D. 1918, incorporating Frank C. Coburn of the Parish of Sheffield in the County of Sunbury and Province of New Brunswick, Lumberman; Ernest M. Coburn of the same place, Lumberman; and Arthur R. Slipp of the City of Fredericton in the County of York, Barrister-at-Law for the following purposes, namely:
