

To carry on a general farming and dairy business.
To purchase, take on lease, hire or otherwise acquire, real and personal property, and to have, hold, occupy and enjoy the same and from time to time sell, lease, let or hire, the same upon such terms as the Company may determine.

To purchase, acquire hold, operate control, lease, mortgage or otherwise pledge, timber licenses, limits and leases, claims, berths, concessions, booming grounds, driving rights, water powers, water rights and privileges.

To acquire, construct, own, manage, operate and generally turn to account tramways, cars or other motor vehicles, railway sidings, switches, spur lines, telegraph and telephone lines, roads, ways, conduits, pipe lines, canals, sewers, drains, wharves, vessels, barges, and otherlike works or services as may be necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Company, and to construct, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, own and operate electric, steam and other powers, and to install, develop, generate, use, sell and distribute steam, electric pneumatic, hydraulic or other power or force or services of any nature whatsoever, provided that any of the foregoing powers in this paragraph mentioned when exercised outside of the property of the Company shall be subject to all Provincial and Municipal laws and regulations in that behalf.

To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of, or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.

To issue and allot fully paid up shares of the capital stock of the Company in payment or part payment of any property, real or personal, and of any rights and concessions purchased and acquired by the Company.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, or to undertake the whole or any part of the business, property or liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company, and to pay for the same either in whole or in part in the bonds, debentures, paid-up shares or other securities of the Company.

To do any and everything necessary, incidental, suitable, convenient or proper for the carrying on of any of the said businesses, or of the accomplishment of any purpose or the attaining of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein contained, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Company.

To do any and all things set forth as objects, purposes, powers or otherwise, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do, and as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, assignees or otherwise. By the name of "Pinder Lumber and Milling Company, Limited" with a total capital stock of Forty-Nine thousand dollars divided into Four hundred and ninety shares of One hundred dollars each, and with the head office at Pinder in the County of York in said Province.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer bearing date the fifth day of December, A. D. 1918, incorporating William Leslie McAdoo, of Kars, in the County of Kings, Lumberman; George Robert McKean, of the City of Saint John, Lumber Merchant; and William Edgar Golding, of the same place, Merchant, all in the Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To construct, erect, establish, or otherwise acquire, own, maintain and operate mills and factories for the manufacture of timber, lumber, pulp wood and any and all articles capable of being manufactured from the products of the forest, and to buy, sell and deal in timber, lumber, pulp wood and products of the forest generally, and all articles manufactured therefrom or in connection therewith, and to do all matters and things necessary or incidental to the carrying on of the business of lumbering in all its branches;

To acquire by purchase, lease, concession, license, exchange or other legal title and to sell and deal in timber licenses, timber lands and limits, wood lots, standing timber, cut timber, water powers, water lots, real and personal property, rights of way and such other property as may be found useful, necessary or expedient in the conduct of all or any of the operations of the Company;

To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in goods, wares and merchandise for the purposes of the Company, and to farm, till, cultivate and develop the lands of the Company and to produce and deal in dairy, farm and garden products of all kinds.

To purchase, build, construct or otherwise acquire, own, charter, maintain, operate, manage, navigate and use, steam and other boats, barges, scows and vessels for the purposes of the Company's business and otherwise;
