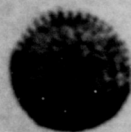

## THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION BOARD REGULATIONS.

**HIS HONOUR** the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to  
approve of the following regulations:

The Workmen's Compensation Board thereby makes the  
following regulations respecting the Workmen's Compensa-  
tion Act:

### REGULATION 1.

For the purpose mentioned in Sec. 45-45-2 of the Act, the  
classes mentioned in that section are hereby arranged and all  
industries within the scope of the Act shall be divided into  
the following classes:

**Class 1**—Coal and other mining; reduction of ores and smelt-  
ing; quarrying; manufacture of brick; lime, glass and cement;  
cutting and dressing of stone or marble; drilling and sinking  
of wells for gas or water.

**Class 2**—Lumbering; logging; saw-mills; manufacture of  
pulp or paper; woodworking; planing mills; furniture factor-  
ies; cooperage; boat building; mattress making; upholstering;  
wicker and rattan work.

**Class 3**—Manufacture of iron and steel and iron and steel  
products; car-shops; manufacture and repair of automobiles;  
vehicles; steel erections; steel shipbuilding and repairing;  
automobile livery, etc.

**Class 4**—Manufacture of compounds, paints, chemicals,  
liquors and beverages; manufacture of leather; leather goods;  
rubber and rubber goods; wholesale and retail stores; flour  
and handling of grain; canning; pork-packing; butchering and  
handling of live stock; manufacture of tobacco and tobacco  
products; manufacture of cloth and textiles; printing; litho-  
graphing; engraving stationery.

**Class 5**—Construction of buildings; wooden ships; mason  
work; painting; structural work; plumbing; gas and steam-  
fitting.

**Class 6**—Construction of bridges (wooden or steel), road-  
making; sewer-construction; excavation, construction and  
operation of electric railways; electric power lines and appli-  
ances; construction of telegraphs and telephones.

**Class 7**—Teaming; cartage; warehousing and storage;  
stevedoring; dredging; pile-driving and subaqueous construc-  
tion; operation of steam railways and navigation.

### REGULATION 2.

Where not more workmen than the number set opposite to  
the name of an industry mentioned in the schedules below are  
usually employed therein, such industry is hereby excluded  
from the scope of Part 1 of the Act, and is withdrawn from  
the class in Regulation 1 in which it would otherwise be in-  
cluded; subject, however, to any conditions attached to such  
industry or to any conditions contained in the schedules, and  
subject to the other regulations of the Board, so far as appli-  
cable.
