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REGULATION 6.

Whenever the word "Act" appears in any of these regula-tions or in any regulations that may be passed by the Board, it shall refer to the Workmen's Compensation Act, and amendments thereto, or that may be hereafter made.

PENALTIES.

REGULATION 7

Any employer failing to pay any assessment or special as-messment, or any prescribed portion thereof, within ten days after notice thereof has been malied to him by registered post, shall pay as a penalty for such default an additional 1 per cent. of the amount unpaid for each calendar month or frac-tion thereof that such default continued, in addition to the pro-visions contained in Section 61, sub-sections 1 and 2 of the Act. BECHLIATION 5 **REGULATION 8.**

Any person who contravenes any regulation of the Work-men's Compensation Board after it has become effective, where no other penalty is provided therefor, shall, for the contravention thereof, incur a penalty not exceeding \$500.00. REGULATION 9.

Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of Section 14 of the Act, shall, for every contravention, incur a penalty not exceeding \$50.00, and shall also be liable to pay to the workman any sum which has been so deducted from his wages, or which he has been required or permitted to pay in contravention of Section 14. REGULATION 10. For every contravention of sub-sections 4 or 5 of Section 40 of the Act, the employer shall incur a penalty not exceed-ing 550.00

ing \$50.00.

REGULATION 11.

Any employer and every person who obstructs or hinders the making of the examination and inquiry mentioned in Sec-tion 70, sub-sections I and 2, of the Act, or refuses to permit it to be made, shall incur a penalty not exceeding \$500.00. REGULATION 12.

Any employer and every such person who obstructs or hin-ders the making of any inspection made under the authority of Section 71 of the Act, or refuses to permit it to be made, shall incur a penalty not exceeding \$500.00. REGULATION 14

REGULATION 14 Every steam engineer contravening sub-section 5 of Sec-tion 48, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$25.00. REGULATIO 14.

Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of Section 72 of the Act shall incur a penalty of \$50.00.
