HIS HONOUR the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Rules and Regulations:

That in addition to the Rules and Regulations passed by the Board-in-Council governing the collection of the Amusement Tax, the following regulation be passed:

"No entertainment of whatever sort or description to which

an admission fee is charged and the proceeds of which are not wholly for patriotic purposes, shall be held without a permit allowing the said entertainment to be held, and providing at the same time for a supply of amusement tax tickets necessary in connection therewith. If such entertainment is held without a permit from the Amusement Tax Inspector, the promoters of the same shall be liable to the penalties provided for in the 11th section of the Theatres and Cinematographs Act."
