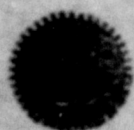

COUNTY COURT NOTICE—RAILWAY ACT

IN THE VICTORIA COUNTY COURT.

In the Matter of the Railway Act and in the matter of an award made in an arbitration between The Canadian (L.S.) Pacific Railway Company, and Nathaniel Stone, to determine the compensation to be paid by the said company for the land of the said Nathaniel Stone, situate in the parish of Grand Falls, in the County of Victoria, under the provisions of the said Act.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the award in this matter, made and published on the fourth day of September, A. D. 1918, and constituting the title of the said The Canadian Pacific Railway Company, to the lands described in the said award, is obtained under the Railway Act, and that an authentic copy of the said award has been delivered to the clerk of the Victoria County Court.
