

## LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

## "THE NEREPI LUMBER COMPANY, LIMITED"

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer bearing date the third day of October, A. D. 1918, incorporating Bliss H. Dunfield of the City of Halifax, in the County of Halifax and Province of Nova Scotia, Lumber Merchant; Harry C. Heans of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Manager, and Gordon G. Scott, of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, Lumberman, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over a certain Saw Mill situate at or near Sagawa in the County of Kings and Province of New Brunswick, owned and conducted by said applicants, and machinery, stock-in-trade, good will and effects thereof, and all interest therein, and to carry on the business of the same.

To carry on the business of a Lumberer, Saw and Planing Mill, and Manufacturer of Lumber and Woodenware, and to buy, own, hold, sell and deal in Timber Limits, Timber Lands and Logs, and to manufacture, buy, sell and deal in Timber and Wood of all kinds, and to manufacture articles in the making of which timber or wood is required, or can be utilized.

To carry on in all its branches a Pulpwood, Lumber and Timber Business, and to carry on any other business whether as Manufacturers, Merchants, or otherwise, which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above.

To carry on a general Mercantile Business, and buy, sell and deal in goods, stores, consumable articles and general property of all kinds both wholesale and retail, and to transact every kind of agency business and generally to engage in any business transaction which may seem to the Company directly or indirectly conducive to its interest.

To carry on all or any of the businesses of Ship Owners, Ship Brokers, Managers of Shipping Property, Freighters, Contractors, Warehousemen, Pondmen, Wharfingers, Stevedores, Barge Owners, Tug Owners, Vessel Owners, Lightermen, Drivers, Dredgers, Towsers and Forwarding Agents, and also as common Carriers by land and water, and to construct, erect, build, make, manufacture, purchase, lease, hire, charter, or otherwise acquire, and to own, hold and operate tramways, motors, barges, boats, driving appliances, bridges, tugs, vessels, and other conveyances, plant and appliances by land and water or shares, interest or rights therein or in any of the same.

To acquire, construct, improve, manage and operate all such tramways, machine shops, warehouses, or other buildings for the storage of goods, wares, merchandise and provisions, railway sidings, switches, and spur lines, lumber yards, piers, dams, driving dams, booms, cranes, hoisting gear and other articles and facilities for loading and discharging vessels, and for driving and storing logs, manufactured lumber and all materials, articles, tools, engines, boilers, tackle, furniture and machinery of all kinds necessary for carrying on the business of the Company.

For the uses and purposes of the Company to purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire, hold, sell or otherwise dispose of electric, steam, water and other powers of any nature whatsoever, and to generate water power, electric power and electric light.

To purchase or otherwise acquire by lease or license from the crown or from any person or persons, company or companies, by assignment or transfer of the lease or license granted by the crown, or any such person or persons, company or companies, or otherwise acquire, hold, sell or otherwise dispose of lumber land, timber limits or other rights to cut timber in New Brunswick.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and hold, sell or otherwise dispose of in whole or in part the Bonds, Capital Stock, Business, Goodwill, Rights, Franchises, Property and Assets of every kind of any person or persons, company or companies, conducting a business within the purposes of this Company, and to pay for the same in money or in the Stock or Bonds of the Company, or otherwise, and to assume in whole or in part or guarantee in whole or in part the liabilities of any such person or persons, company or companies, whose business may be acquired by the Company, and to exercise all the rights, powers and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange or otherwise lands, buildings, and hereditaments of any nature or description that the situate in the Province of New Brunswick or elsewhere, and to sell, mortgage or otherwise encumber or dispose of lands, tenements and hereditaments and to erect, alter, repair and maintain buildings upon such lands in which the Company may have an interest.

To purchase, operate, sell, lease or otherwise obtain or dispose of Mills, Machinery and all other kinds of personal property necessary for or incidental to the manufacture of logs and timber, or in any way incident to the within mentioned business and undertakings.

No object, purpose, or power, or any statement contained in any of the above clauses shall be in any way limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other clause, but shall be construed as independent purposes and powers: by the name of "The Nerepis Lumber Company Limited" with a total Capital Stock of Nine Thousand Dollars, divided into Ninety Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, and with the Head Office at Welsford, in the County of Kings and Province of New Brunswick.
