PROCLAMATION.

UNDER and by virtue of Section 79 of Part 1 and Section 85
of Part 2 of the Acts of the Legislative Assembly, 3 George
V., 1918, Chapter 37, entitled "An Act to provide for Compen-
sation to Workmen for Injuries sustained and Industrial Dis-
eases contracted in the course of their employment," and by
an Order-in-Council thereunder made, and pursuant to the
power and authority thereby in me vested, I do order and de-
clare that all the remaining provisions of Part 1 of said Act
not referred to and proclaimed by the Proclamation made un-
der the provisions of the said Act, dated the seventeenth day
of September, A. D. 1918, and all the provisions of Part 2 of
said Act, shall come into force and become effective on, from
and after the second day of January, in the year of our Lord
one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.
