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NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Saint John River Log Driving Company will, at the next Session of the Legislature of New Brunswick, make application for the passing of an Act to amend and in addition to the Act 9 Edward VII., Cap. LXXVI, intituled An Act to consolidate and amend the various Acts relating to the Saint John River Log Driving Company, namely, to do away with the privilege, franchise and liability of the Company to drive the Aroostook River, to allow of rafting in joints and or brails, to strike out proviso in Section 21 of said Act relating to unmarked logs, to amend Section 22 of said Act to provide for 30 days notice instead of 3 days' notice, to amend Section 35 to increase borrowing powers, and further to authorize the said Company to make a charge or assessment upon the owners of all logs that may be placed in the Saint John River or its tributaries above the lower boom of said Company, for the upkeep and maintenance of the booms, piers and other appliances of the said Company.
