THOMPSON MACHINERY COMPANY, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer bearing date the seventh day of March, A. D. 1918, incorporating Howard P. Robinson, Broker; Richard Sullivan, Merchant, and Thomas Bell, Merchant, all of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on a general manufacturing foundry and machine business and to manufacture machines, machinery, implements, appliances, tools and other articles of every nature and kind.

To buy, sell, trade and deal in and with machines, machinery, implements, appliances, tools and other articles.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over as a going concern or otherwise, upon such terms as to the directors may seem advisable, all or any part of the undertaking, assets, business and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business in whole or in part similar to any which this company is authorized to carry on or possessed or property, plant, concessions, rights or privileges suitable or convenient for the purposes of this company, or any of them, and to assume, carry on and continue the same.
