## ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS UNDER PUBLIC HEALTH ACT.

### Nuisances.

130. No owner, proprietor, householder, occupier or tenant, nor any captain or master of any ship, shall commit or maintain or suffer to be committed or maintained, any nuisance in or upon any house, land, ship, or other property of which he is either temporarily or permanently in possession or command.

131. No person shall commit or maintain any nuisance in or upon any public place, or any street, nor shall any person deposit sputum in or upon any public conveyance, street, or the floors, stairs or other parts of any building or ship.

132. No hogs shall be kept within the limits of any city. No hogs shall be kept within the limits of any town or incorporated village except by written permit of the sub-district Board of Health concerned, and so such permit shall be issued by such Board, for the keeping of such animals within 100 feet of any inhabited house.

133. Cows shall not be kept in any city, except that, in any sparsely built-up portion of a city the sub-district Board may license the keeping of not more than one cow by any householder, but no such permit shall issue for the keeping of any such animal within 50 feet of any inhabited house. Cows shall not be kept within the limits of any town or incorporated village without a permit from the sub-district Board concerned.

134. In cities, towns and incorporated villages, no horse-stable shall be established or maintained in which more than two horses are, or are intended to be kept without a permit from the sub-district Board concerned, and in every instance of a horse-stable being maintained within the said places, such stable shall be kept in a sanitary condition, and in conformity with such regulations or bye-laws relating thereto as the sub-district Board concerned may, from time to time, lay down in accordance with law.

135. No stables or other places in which animals are kept, whether in urban or in rural communities, shall be so situated that the drainage therefrom shall pollute, or shall be liable to pollute any source of water used for domestic purposes.

136. In cities, towns and in villages all manure from a stable in which any animal is kept shall be deposited in a manure bin or other receptacle so constructed that it shall be impervious to flies and rain, and such bin or receptacle shall not at any time be completely filled, and shall be emptied not less frequently than each two weeks.

137. In cities, towns and villages, all privies shall be supplied with vaults of concrete or other material impervious to liquids, and shall be cleaned at least twice in every year, once in spring, not later than the first of June, and once in Autumn, not earlier, if the cleaning be made only twice yearly, than the first of October. Such cleaning shall take place at such hours and be so conducted as not to be offensive to the adjacent neighborhood. Such cleaning shall be done only by person authorized so to do, by the sub-district Board concerned, and the contents of said vaults shall be deposited in such place and under such conditions as shall be laid down by the said sub-district Board.
