By HIS HONOUR WILLIAM PUGSLEY, D.C.L.,
LL. D., K. C., P. C., Lieutenant-Governor of
the Province of New Brunswick.

WILLIAM PUGSLEY

WHEREAS the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands
prorogued to Thursday, the twenty-third of January inst.
I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative As-
sembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to
Thursday, the sixth day of March next.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the twenty-
second day of January, in the year of our Lord one
thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the ninth
year of His Majesty's Reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

E. L. NEWCOMBE.

WHEREAS, it seems to Us fitting that a day should be set
apart for a Day of Intercession for the Peace Confer-
ence—

Now Therefore Know Ye that We have thought fit by and
with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada to appoint
and set apart the sixteenth day of February next to be
throughout the Dominion of Canada a day of humble prayer
and intercession to Almighty God that His blessings may rest
upon the Peace Conference, and that under His direction and
guidance its deliberations and conclusions may result in the
establishment of a world-wide peace on a just and permanent
foundation; and We do invite all Our loving subjects through-
out Canada to observe the said day as solemnly set apart and
consecrated for this purpose.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these
presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice, and
govern themselves accordingly.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Our Letters
to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Canada to be
hereunto affixed. Witness: Our Right Trusty and Right
Entirely Beloved Cousin and Counsellor, Victor Chris-
tian William, Duke of Devonshire, Marquess of Hart-
ington, Earl of Devonshire, Earl of Burlington, Baron
Cavendish of Hardwicke, Baron Cavendish of Keighley,
Knight of Our Most Honourable Privy Council; Knight
Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint

Michael and Saint George; Knight Grand Cross of Our
Royal Victorian Order; Governor General and Comman-
der-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this
twenty-third day of January, in the year of Our Lord
one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the
ninth year of Our Reign.
