## LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF N. B.

### RULES AND PRACTICE OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

#### Private and Local Bills.

77. A typewritten copy or printed copy of every Private Bill or Local Bill introduced into this House shall be filed with the Clerk of the House within ten days after the opening of the Session, and in case of failure to comply with this provision the fee on the introduction of any such Private Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Rule 84, applicable to such Bill, and Local Bills introduced after ten days of the opening of the Session shall pay the same fee as a Private Bill.

78. No Private Bill, or Bill making an amendment of a like nature to a former Act, shall be received by the House unless a notice specifying clearly and distinctly the nature and the objects thereof, has been published four successive weeks previous to the meeting of the Legislature, or to the introduction of the Bill, in some one of the newspapers published in the County interested in or to be affected, by the measure, or in the locality where the parties affected, or the majority of them reside; and when no newspaper is published in such County or locality, then in some newspaper having general circulation in such County or locality, and also in the Royal Ga-
