Under and by virtue of Section 3, Chapter 23, of the Acts of the Legislative Assembly, 2 George the Fifth, 1919, entitled "An Act to establish the New Brunswick Game Refuge" and of an Order-in-Council thereunder made, and pursuant to the power and authority thereby in me vested, I do hereby order and declare that the said Act as provided in and by said Section 3 thereof, shall come into force and become effective on, from and after the first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

To all to whom these presents shall come, or whom the same may in anywise concern—Greeting:

A PROCLAMATION

W. STUART EDWARDS,
For Deputy Minister of Justice, Canada.

Whereas, it seems to Us fitting that a day should be set apart as a Public Holiday and a Day of General Thanksgiving for the Victories that have been won by the Allied Armies, in the War against the Central Powers of Europe, and for the Treaty of Peace signed by the contending Nations, involving a

general surrender by the Enemy.

Now, Know Ye, that We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, have thought fit to appoint and do appoint Saturday, the nineteenth day of July, in this present year, to be observed throughout Our Dominion of Canada as a Public Holiday and a Day of General Thanksgiving for the Victories won by the Allied Armies in the War against the Central Powers of Europe and for the Treaty of Peace signed by the contending Nations, involving a general surrender by the Enemy.

And we do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to set apart the said day for this purpose.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness: Our Right Trusty and Right Entirely Beloved Cousin and Counsellor, Victor Christian William, Duke of Devonshire, Marquess of Hartington, Earl of Devonshire, Earl of Burlington, Baron Cavendish of Hardwicke, Baron Cavendish of Keighley, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter; one of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Knight Grand Cross of Our Royal Victorian Order; Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this Eighth day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the tenth year of Our Reign.
