**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, bearing date the fourth day of June, A. D. 1919, incorporating John H. Hickman, of Dorchester, in the County of Westmorland, in the Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Fred Clinton Palmer, of the same place, Merchant; Charles S. Hickman, of the same place, Lumberman; and W. Hazen Chapman of the same place, Barrister-at-law, for the following purposes, namely:

For the purpose of generating, selling, leasing and using electricity for lighting, communicating, heating and mechanical purposes, and other and all such purposes, and for supplying the Town and Parish of Dorchester and those parts or districts of the Parish of Sackville locally known as "Woodhurst," "Fairfield," and "Fairview" and the works and premises now or recently of "The Intercolonial Copper Company," in said Parish of Sackville, and for supplying the said Town and Parish of Dorchester and said parts of the Parish of Sackville and places adjacent thereto, with electric light, heat and power, and for carrying on and maintaining all necessary works in connection therewith.
