

sion or otherwise, with any person, partnership, company or corporation carrying on or engaged in, or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which this Company is authorized to engage in or carry on, or to amalgamate with any such company.

To raise and assist in raising money for and to aid by the way of bonus, loan, promise, indorsement, guarantee of bonds, debentures or otherwise, any other company or corporation carrying on business similar either in whole or in part to that of the company, and to guarantee the performance of contracts by any companies, corporations, firms or individuals with whom the company may have business relations.

To sell, lease, exchange or otherwise dispose of, in whole or in part the property, rights or undertakings of the Company for such consideration as may be agreed upon, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To do all such other Acts and things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects, or any of them, and to carry on any business, whether manufacturing or otherwise germane to the purposes, and objects set forth and which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on by the Company or calculated, directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of its properties or rights.

To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing, repairing, mercantile or otherwise) which may seem to the company capable of being carried on in connection with their plant, power or machinery, including plumbing, gas fitting, electric supplies and work in repairing gasoline or motor engines or automobiles, or plumbing repairs, and work in connection with the machine shop attached with their engine and power room, calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render more profitable any of the Company's business, property or rights.
