

A. D. 1919, incorporating Arthur S. Creighton, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Banker; Henry A. Powell, of the same place, Barrister-at-Law; and Charles O. Morris, of the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John, Clerk, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on in all its branches the business of building, repairing, purchasing, leasing, chartering or otherwise acquiring, operating and maintaining and selling, hiring, chartering or otherwise disposing of ships, tugs, boats, lighters, barges, dredges, scows and all other vessels, and all furniture, tackle, gear and equipment therefor of all kinds.

To carry on the business of carrying and transporting and contracting for and procuring the carrying and transporting of by land or by water or both, all passengers, mail and freight.

To carry on the business of lumbering in all its branches, and to manufacture, trade in, get out, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hire or otherwise dispose of deals, scantling, boards, shingles, laths, planks, pulp wood, whether round, barked or otherwise, logs, spars, piles, knees, buttocks, round and square timber of all kinds, and all goods, wares and merchandise into the construction of which wood, iron or other metals enter wholly or in part, and to import and export the same or any thereof.

To carry on a general mercantile business and purchase or otherwise acquire, sell or otherwise dispose of and deal in goods, wares and merchandise of all kinds.

To carry on the business of constructing all erections, buildings or structures, and particularly but not so as to limit the generality of the foregoing words of this paragraph, construct buildings, railways, tramways, streets, sidewalks, pavements, sewers, water and gas pipe lines, wharves, docks, piers, dams, breakwaters and embankments, into the construction of which earth, sand, stone, brick, cement, concrete, wood, iron, steel or other minerals or metals enter wholly or in part.

To carry on the business of excavating and removing earth, sand, rock and other minerals.

To build, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, maintain and operate, and sell, hire or otherwise dispose of, saw mills, machine shops, factories, wharves, docks, booms, piers, warehouses, tramways, railway sidings and railway spurs, as the Company may deem necessary or expedient for any of the purposes aforesaid.

For the purposes aforesaid, or any thereof, to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, all lands, timber licenses, timber privileges, quarries, mines, water powers and water rights, which the Company may deem necessary or advisable for any of the above purposes or objects; and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same or any part thereof as the Company may deem desirable.

To do any of the above things as principal, agent, contractor or otherwise, or by or through trustees or agents or otherwise, either alone or in conjunction with others.

The powers in the preceding paragraphs mentioned shall not be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other paragraph or by reference to or inference from the name of the Company; by the name of "The Miramichi Construction Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of forty-five thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and fifty shares of one hundred dollars each and with the head office at Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland and Province of New Brunswick.

READY'S BEVERAGES, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer bearing date the seventeenth day of March A. D. 1919, incorporating Joseph Leo O'Brien, Accountant; Harry Barr Tippet, Traveller; and William Joseph Murphy, Bookkeeper, all of the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over as a going concern all or any part of the brewing, malting, aerating, bottling and other like lines of business now or hereafter carried on by any person or persons, company or companies, in the Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere, with the good will thereof and all or any part of the real estate, plant, machinery, stock in trade, debts and other assets of the said businesses, and to pay for the same either in cash, in debentures or in shares or partly in cash and partly in debentures and partly in shares.

To carry on business as brewers, malsters, bottlers, manufacturers and producers of and merchants and dealers in ale, porter and stout and lager and other beers and minerals and aerated waters and other products and all by-products thereof and all hops, malts, grain, meal, yeast and all other materials and all other articles and things used or capable of being used in or in connection with any such business and to carry on the business of cold storage and cold storage warehousemen.

To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with any of the above businesses, or objects or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the company's properties or rights for the time being.

To establish and carry on agencies, depots and branch places of business.

To buy, lease, or otherwise acquire, own and hold lands and other property, and to build, erect, purchase, or otherwise acquire and to own, hold and operate breweries, factories, machines, machinery and other property, plant and premises for brewing, malting, aerating, bottling or manufacturing purposes in connection with any of the businesses of the company.

To purchase or otherwise acquire, take and hold any gov-

ernment or municipal licenses or concessions, or any formulae, receipts, processes, letters patent, trade marks, trade names or copyrights or any rights or interests in the same, and to use and exercise the same and grant licenses in respect thereof or otherwise turn the same to account.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and to assume and undertake all or any part of the business, property, privileges, contracts, rights and other assets and the debts, obligations and other liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business which this company is authorized to carry on or any business similar thereto or possessed of property suitable for the purposes thereof or which the company may be hereby empowered to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, and to pay for the same wholly or in part in shares, stock, bonds, debentures or other securities of the company.

To sell, lease, let, exchange or otherwise dispose of, encumber or deal with the undertaking of the company, or with the real and personal property and assets of the company or any part thereof for such consideration as the company may deem fit, including shares, bonds, debentures or other interests in or securities of any company.

To enter into any arrangement for sharing of profits, or union of interests with any employee of the company or with any person or company carrying on or engaged in any business or transaction with the company, or which the company is authorized to carry on or engage in, and to make advances to, guarantee the contracts of, indemnify or otherwise assist any such person or company.

To use any of the funds of the company to purchase or otherwise acquire and to take and hold stock, shares, bonds, debentures or other interests in or securities of any other company or corporation, foreign or otherwise, and while holding the same to exercise all the rights and powers of ownership thereof, including the voting powers.

To amalgamate with any other company or companies having objects or powers in whole or in part similar to those of the said Company.

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real and personal property and any rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business.

To issue fully or partly paid stock, shares, bonds or debentures of the company in payment of or in part payment for any real or personal property, assets, franchises, options or other rights or privileges acquired by the company, or for any services rendered to the company.

The powers hereinbefore granted shall be exercised subject to all Dominion, Provincial and Municipal regulations affecting the exercise thereof.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made, by the Town of Bathurst, to the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, at its next session, for the passing of an Act to amend Chapter 70 of the Acts of Assembly of New Brunswick, 1917, by striking out the word "ten" in the fourth line and substituting the word "twenty" in lieu thereof, and thereby allowing the Town Council every year to borrow temporarily, or until the taxes are collected in each year, a sum or sums of money not exceeding in all the sum of twenty thousand dollars, to be repaid within the period of one year as soon as the taxes are collected, in lieu of the borrowing powers given by sub-section (2) of section 71 of The Towns Incorporation Act.
