THE FEES to be taken upon the incorporation of companies by letters patent under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, section 12, sub-section (2) for charitable, philanthropic, temperance, religious, social, literary, educational, or other like purposes, where there is no capital stock and where the cost value of the real and personal property specified under section 17, sub-section 2, paragraph E, shall be as follows:

Where the cost value does not exceed \$1,000.....a fee of \$10.00  
Over \$1,000.00 and under \$2,000.00 ..... " " 15.00  
Over \$2,000.00 and under \$3,000.00 ..... " " 20.00  
Over \$3,000.00 and under \$4,000.00 ..... " " 40.00  
Over \$4,000.00 and under \$5,000.00 ..... " " 30.00  
And for \$5,000.00 and upwards the same fee shall be charged as for trading companies. Also that the fee for one insertion in the Royal Gazette of the notice of granting letters patent shall be \$2.20 per square.
