McADAM CO-OPERATIVE, LIMITED.

D. 1929, incorporating Herbert Priestman, C. P. R. Storekeeper; Gregory A. T. Lister, Fitter; Frederick A. Mallinson, Boiler-maker; Hugh A. Thomas, Chief Clerk, and Edgar H. Estabrooks, B. & B. Foreman; all of the Parish of McAdam, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on business as merchants, manufacturers and dealers in all kinds of groceries, foodstuffs, provisions, drugs, chemicals, medicines, soaps, perfumery, chemists' sundries and supplies and other articles and commodities of personal and household use and consumption.
