

capacity to exercise and to operate thereunder.

To pay for any business, undertaking, assets, patents, inventions, concessions, franchises, lands, tenements or hereditaments, or for any other property or rights acquired by the company in whole or in part by the issue of fully paid up or partly paid up shares of the company.

To construct or acquire by lease, purchase or otherwise and to operate in connection with the works, lines and business of the company and for the purposes thereof lines of telegraph or telephone for the purposes and use of the company or other works and means of communication on property owned, leased or under control of the company by permission of the owners thereof.

To aid any industry or enterprise agreeing to use or using power supplied by the company or agreeing to supply or supplying power to the company and to acquire stock in any company or concern carrying on or having power to carry on any industries, and the securities or obligations of any such company or concern, and to manage any such company or industry.

To engage in and deal as contractors for the sale, lease or other disposal of appliances, electric, hydraulic, pneumatic, steam or gas and the installation thereof.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise and to construct, equip, maintain and operate and attach to the shores or banks of rivers and streams all the dams, wing dams, sluices, piers, booms, wharves, conduits, railways, tunnels, buildings, or other works of any description necessary for generating electricity, light, heat or power or for operating any sawmill, grist mill or pulp mill or other manufactures, which the company may deem it necessary or expedient to operate or to furnish power for, or if necessary for holding logs, timber and wood required to be held for manufacturing purposes, or for conveying logs, timber and wood down any river or stream past the works of the company, or for the purpose of making improvements in said rivers or streams by flowing said rivers and streams with the consent of the riparian owners thereof, as will enable the company to store water for the purpose of increasing the volume of water in times of drought.

To sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the whole or any part of the business, undertaking, assets liabilities and franchises of the company to any other person, company or corporation for such consideration as the company may think fit, and either in whole or in part for securities or paid up stock or shares of any company or corporation which may acquire the whole or any part of the undertaking of the company.

To consolidate or amalgamate with any other company or corporation having objects similar in whole or in part to those of this company.

To promote any company or corporation having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this company or carrying on any business capable of being carried on so as directly or indirectly to benefit this company.

To enter into any agreement for sharing of profits, union of interests, co-operation, joint adventure, reciprocal concession, or otherwise with any person, firm, company or corporation carrying on or engaged in, or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this company, and to take or otherwise acquire shares and securities of any such company, and to hold, sell or otherwise deal in the same.

While not in any way restricting the foregoing, to produce, buy, sell, import, export and distribute electricity, steam or natural gas for the purposes of heat, light and power.

To purchase or otherwise acquire the shares, bonds, debentures, or other securities of any other company or corporation, and to pay for the same in the shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of this company or otherwise, and to hold, sell, vote or otherwise deal in the shares, bonds, debentures or other securities so purchased and to guarantee payment of the principal of or dividends and interest on said shares, bonds, debentures or other securities.

To have, exercise and enjoy the rights, franchises and privileges in and by section 18 of The New Brunswick Companies Act authorized to be granted, namely, to enter from time to time upon any public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground, or highways in any city, town or parish in the County of Madawaska, and break up and open such public roads, streets, squares, plots of ground or highways or any part thereof, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and posts, and stringing and maintaining wires for telegraph, telephone or electric light purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same and for the placing and maintaining under ground, along or across such public streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways, streets, mains, pipes or conduits for the conveying of sewerage, water, steam or gas for motive power or for sanitary, heating or lighting purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same, and to use, exercise, possess and enjoy such rights, privileges, franchises and powers, subject to such limitations and conditions as may be imposed upon the exercise thereof as fully and completely as if the same had been specially granted to the company by Act of Assembly.

Before such company shall break up and open any part of said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground, bridges and

highways, the company shall give previous notice of their intention so to do in writing to the City or Town Council in any city or incorporated town, or to a supervisor or road commissioner in any parish or part of a parish in which it is proposed to break up and open any part of said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground, bridges and highways, and shall receive the consent in writing so to do of such City or Town Council or supervisor or road commissioner as the case may be, and not otherwise.

The said Company shall and do, at their own proper cost and charges, and to the satisfaction of such City or Town Council or supervisor or road commissioner, and without unnecessary delay, repair and amend the said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground and highways, pavements or sidewalks in every part where they shall be so broken up and opened as aforesaid to the condition to which they were before breaking up or opening the same.

No poles or wires or conduits shall be placed in such a way as to interfere with the poles or wires or conduits of any telephone, telegraph or electric light company now existing, or so as to injure or impair the effective working of any telephone, telegraph or electric light system in operation in this Province in places where any such system may be in operation before such Company hereby incorporated establishes its system, it being understood, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent such company hereby incorporated from erecting its poles or placing its conduits or stringing its wires or laying the same underground on the opposite side of any highway or street to that occupied by the poles or wires of any existing telephone, telegraph or electric light system.

Provided, also, that such corporation, its agents and workmen shall not in the execution of any of the powers herein given, do or permit any unnecessary damage, nor shall they cut down or injure any fruit, shade or ornamental tree, nor in any way obstruct the entrance to any door or gateway or place any post or pole directly opposite any window of any store, dwelling house, schoolhouse or place of divine worship, or in any ditch of any street or highway.

Any poles used in any city town or village by such company shall be straight cedar poles of a reasonable size and of sufficient length that any wires placed thereon by such Company shall be not less than 20 feet above the ground, street, road or highway over which the same are placed.

The Company shall not have the right to sell electricity within the Town limits of the Town of Edmundston for lighting purposes, except direct to the Town.

The Company shall have the right to sell electricity within the Town limits of the Town of Edmundston for power purposes, provided it has obtained the leave of the Town Council for so doing.

The Company shall not have the right to sell electricity within the Town limits of the Town of St. Leonards except direct to the Town; by the name of "The Madawaska Light and Power Company, Limited," with a capital stock of three hundred thousand dollars, divided into three thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head office at the Town of Edmundston, in the County of Madawaska and Province of New Brunswick.

The constructing, acquiring, chartering, owning, operating and maintaining one or more steamboats, gasoline or motor boats, sailing or other vessels for conveying goods, carrying trade and other traffic, as well as passengers, and for the purpose of steam navigation between points or places on the Miramichi River and ports within the Province of New Brunswick on the Gulf of St. Lawrence and elsewhere within the Province of New Brunswick as the said Company may deem expedient; by the name of "Miramichi River Service, Limited," with a capital stock of twenty-four thousand nine hundred dollars, divided into four hundred and ninety-eight shares of fifty dollars each, with the head office at Chatham, in the County of Northumberland, and Province of New Brunswick.
