

supplies, cast iron and steel pipes, automobiles, bicycles, rubber goods vegetable and chemical products, fire-arms, ammunition, dynamite and explosives generally, or any other raw or manufactured products and any accessories used in the business or manufacture of hardware or relating thereto.

To carry on business as bakers, confectioners and biscuit manufacturers and to deal in cooked goods of all kinds and descriptions whatsoever, and in all materials required in connection with the same, and to carry on the business of refreshment room proprietors and refreshment caterers in all its respective branches.

To carry on the business of manufacturing, wholesale and retail jewellers and dealers in precious stones, jewellery, watches, clocks, gold and silverware, plate, electro-plate, cutlery, glass, china, crockeryware, enamel goods, military badges and jewellers' sundries.

To carry on business as manufacturers and wholesale and retail dealers in and producers of dairy, farm, garden and orchard produce of all kinds, and in particular milk, cream, butter, cheese, poultry and eggs, fruit and vegetables, and also beverages of all kinds and supplies of which any of the said articles form a component part.

To carry on business as butchers and fish merchants in all their respective branches.

To buy, sell, exchange and deal in all kinds of lumber timber, shingles, coal, wood, metallic sheeting, brick, cement concrete blocks tile, lime sand and all other materials required for use in the erection and repair of all kinds of buildings.

To carry on the businesses of importers, exporters, manufacturers, tailors and dealers in clothing of all kinds, tailor's trimmings and sundries, hats, caps, haberdashery, gentlemen's furnishings, millinery, water-proof goods and wearing apparel of every description, and all other articles and materials which may be conveniently and advantageously dealt in or manufactured in connection with such businesses, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, to manufacture, buy, sell, job and deal in woollen, worsted, linen, silk, cotton and other textile fabrics and goods composed in whole or in part of cotton, flax, hemp, wool, silk or other material.

To manufacture, export and import, buy and sell and otherwise handle and deal in and dispose of boots, shoes, gaiters, rubbers and every kind and description of footwear.

To carry on business as wholesale and retail dealers in and exporters and importers of stationery, ornaments, small ware, fancy goods, books, toys of all kinds, music and musical instruments, leather goods, household furnishings and fittings, upholstery, sporting goods, feathers, tobacco, cigars cigarettes, pipes and smokers' utensils.

To carry on generally in all their branches the business of laundry proprietors, outfitters and general supply dealers, and to transact all kinds of agency business.

To carry on the business of a co-operative store and store-keeper in all its branches, and in particular to buy, sell manufacture and deal in goods, stores, consumable articles, chattels, and effects of all kinds, both wholesale and retail, and generally to engage in any business or transaction which may seem to the company directly or indirectly conducive to the interest or convenience of the company's members or their friends, or any section thereof.

To purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any real and personal property, and any rights or privileges which the company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business, and in particular any land, buildings, easements, machinery, plant and stock in trade.

To do any and all of the above things as manufacturers, importers, exporters, wholesalers or retailers, and as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise, and by or through trustees, agents or otherwise and either alone or in conjunction with others.

To issue and allot as fully paid up stock shares of the capital stock of the company as consideration in whole or in part for property, real and personal, acquired by the company.

To invest and deal with the moneys of the company not immediately required in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

That the place within the Province of New Brunswick which is to be the chief place of business of the said Company is at the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, and it is provided that at all general and special meetings of the shareholders of the Company, each and every shareholder shall be entitled to one vote only, irrespective of the number of shares of stock held by him; by the name of "Fredericton Co-operative Limited," with a capital stock of forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into nine thousand eight hundred shares of five dollars each, with the head office at the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick.

THE RIDGE COAL & BRICK COMPANY, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under the New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the seventh day of April, A. D. 1929, incorporating Richard Maxwell McCarty, Agent; Henry Holland Brewer, Contractor, both of the City of Saint John, in the County and Province of New Brunswick; Edgar R. Teed, Merchant, and Edgar W. Mair, Merchant, both of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes namely:

1. To purchase, take over or otherwise acquire from the Ridge Coal Company, Limited, a body corporate duly incorporated under the laws of the Province of New Brunswick, the business now carried on by said Ridge Coal Company, Limited, in the County of Queens, in the Province of New Brunswick, with all the assets, stock-in-trade, mining leases and licenses, mills and machinery and mining machinery and apparatus and all other real and personal property of said Ridge Coal Company, Limited, now owned or used in connection with the business

carried on by them in said County of Queens, and the good will thereof, and all rights and contracts now held by them, subject to the obligations and liabilities, if any, affecting the same.

2. To acquire by purchase or otherwise and hold and dispose of mining rights, mining areas and mining properties.

3. To prospect for, develop, work, mine, produce, manufacture, refine and prepare for sale and distribution, acquire, purchase lease sell or otherwise dispose of and deal in minerals coal, coke, brick, clay, fire clay, cement, oil, shale and all by-products which may be derived therefrom and to cut, saw, mill and prepare for market timber, lumber, logs, pulpwood and all products of the forest.

4. To carry on the business of a wholesale and retail merchant, importer, exporter and dealer generally in coal, coke, peat, oil, brick, wood and fuel of all kinds.

5. To carry on the business of manufacturing, producing, generating, buying, selling, disposing, distributing and dealing in gas and electricity for the purposes of lighting, heating and motor power, and to acquire, manufacture, construct, lay, erect, maintain and operate all works for holding, receiving and distributing gas and electricity for light, heating and motor power and all buildings, works, structures, apparatus, poles, machinery, wires, appliances fittings and supplies necessary or advisable in connection with said business, subject always to local, municipal and provincial restrictions in that behalf, and subject to the following conditions:

(1) Before such company shall break up and open any part of said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground, bridges and highways, the company shall give previous notice of their intention so to do in writing to the City or Town Council in any city or incorporated town, or to a supervisor or road commissioner in any parish or part of a parish in which it is proposed to break up and open any part of said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground, bridges and highways, and shall receive the consent in writing so to do, of such City or Town Council or supervisor or road commissioner, as the case may be, and not otherwise.

(2) That such company shall and do at their own proper cost and charges, and to the satisfaction of such City or Town Council or supervisor or road commissioner, and without unnecessary delay, repair and amend the said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground and highways, pavements or sidewalks in every part where they shall be so broken up and opened as fore-said to the condition to which they were before breaking up or opening the same.

(3) No poles or wires or conduits shall be placed in such a way as to interfere with the poles or wires or conduits of any telephone, telegraph or electric light company now existing, or so as to injure or impair the effective working of any telephone, telegraph or electric light system in operation in this Province in places where any such system may be in operation before such company hereby incorporated establishes its system, it being understood, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent such Company hereby incorporated from erecting its poles or placing its conduits or stringing its wires or laying the same underground on the opposite side of any highway or street to that occupied by the poles or wires of any existing telephone, telegraph or electric light system.

(4) Provided also that such corporation, its agents and workmen, shall not in the execution of any of the powers herein given, do or permit any unnecessary damage, nor shall they cut down or injure any fruit, shade or ornamental tree, nor in any way obstruct the entrance to any door or gateway, or place any post or pole directly opposite any window of any store, dwelling house, school house or place of divine worship, or in any ditch of any street or highway.

(5) Any poles used in any City, Town or Village by such company shall be straight cedar poles of a reasonable size and of sufficient length that any wires placed thereon by such company shall be not less than 20 feet above the ground, street, road, or highway over which the same are placed.

6. To carry on the business of manufacturers of and dealers in brick of all kinds, terra cotta tiles, drain and sewer pipes, cement, lime and all compositions into which the said articles and materials can be converted or used and for that purpose to establish, erect, maintain and operate, kilns, warehouses, agencies, which may be deemed necessary or convenient.

7. To construct own, purchase, hold, operate and dispose of, telegraph and telephone lines, roads, tramways, steamboats, barges and other vessels wharves, coal pockets and other works necessary for the purposes of the Company, subject to same provisions as under paragraph 5.

8. To acquire, hold, manage, own, control and operate, water powers and water privileges for similar, manufacturing, domestic and other purposes.

9. To purchase, own, lease or otherwise acquire and hold patents and patent rights or other rights, and use, sell, let or dispose of the same as the company shall deem proper.

10. To issue and allot fully paid up shares of the capital stock of the Company in payment or part payment of any property, real or personal and of rights and concessions purchased or acquired by the Company and of any services rendered the company.

11. To carry on a general mercantile and provision business both wholesale and retail at or in the neighborhood of any of the Company's works or plants.

12. To enter into any agreement with any Railway Company or companies for the construction, use and operation of a spur line or siding or branch line of railway connecting mines or property of the said Company with any line of railway or other means of transportation.

13. To construct, erect, repair and alter buildings and structures of every nature and deal in building materials.

14. To remunerate by payments in cash, stock, bonds or in any other manner any person or persons or corporation or corporations for services rendered or to be rendered in placing, assisting to place, guaranteeing, underwriting, or selling any of the shares of stock or other securities of the company or in or about the formation of the company or in the conduct of its business.

15. To distribute in specie or otherwise as may be resolved, any assets of the company among its members, and particularly the shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of any
