

Order shall be an offence and the person committing the same shall, upon summary conviction, be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for a first offence and for any second or subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than twenty dollars nor more than forty dollars, and in default of payment of either penalty forthwith may be committed to jail for a period not exceeding one month.

And His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor and the Committee of the Executive Council concurring in the said report and recommendation it is accordingly so ordered.

THE FEES to be taken upon the incorporation of companies by letters patent under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1914, section 17, sub-section (2) for charitable, philanthropic, temperance, religious, social, literary, educational, or other like purposes, where there is no capital stock and where the cost value of the real and personal property specified under section 17, sub-section 2, paragraph E, shall be as follows:

Where the cost value does not exceed \$1,000.....	a fee of \$10.00
Over \$1,000.00 and under \$2,000.00	" " " 15.00
Over \$2,000.00 and under \$3,000.00	" " " 20.00
Over \$3,000.00 and under \$4,000.00	" " " 25.00
Over \$4,000.00 and under \$5,000.00	" " " 30.00
Over \$5,000.00 and under \$6,000.00	" " " 35.00
Over \$6,000.00 and under \$7,000.00	" " " 40.00
Over \$7,000.00 and under \$8,000.00	" " " 45.00
Over \$8,000.00 and under \$9,000.00	" " " 50.00
Over \$9,000.00 and under \$10,000.00	" " " 55.00
Over \$10,000.00 and upwards the same fee shall be charged as for trading companies. Also that the fee for one insertion in the Royal Gazette of the notice of granting letters patent shall be \$2.50 per square.
