**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, A. D. 1920, incorporating Ernest Deming, Lumberman; Harold C. Deming, Lumberman; both of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton and Province of New Brunswick, and Kenneth J. MacRae, Barrister-at-law, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes namely:

To construct, erect, establish or otherwise acquire, own, maintain and operate mills and factories for the manufacture of timber, lumber, pulp wood and any and all articles capable of being manufactured from the products of the forest and to buy, sell and deal in timber, lumber, pulp wood and products of the forest generally and all articles manufactured therefrom or in connection therewith, and to do all matters and things necessary or incidental to the carrying on of the business of lumbering in all its branches.

D. 1920, incorporating Thomas Edward Totten, Druggist; Jessie Nevins, wife of Charles T. Nevins, Druggist, both of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; and James Grant Stenhouse, Druggist, of the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, for the following purposes, namely:

To conduct and carry on a general drug business within the Province of New Brunswick and also to buy, sell and manufacture drugs, chemicals and medicines, patent and proprietary medicinal preparations and to do all things necessary or incidental thereto.

To conduct and carry on the business of chemists, druggists, oil and color men, importers, manufacturers of and dealers in pharmaceutical, medicinal, chemical, industrial and other preparations and articles, compounds, cements, oils, paints, pigments, varnishes, drug dye ware, paint and color grinders, makers and dealers in proprietary articles of all kinds, and all electrical, chemical, photographic, surgical and scientific apparatus and materials.

To acquire all and any receipts and processes for the purpose of manufacturing and the right to manufacture and deal in all medicinal preparations and patent medicines and to carry on the manufacture and sale of any such medicines and preparations and generally to carry on the business of manufacturers, buyers and sellers of and dealers in all kinds of medicines and medicinal preparations and drugs whatsoever.
