WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday, the twentieth day of May instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday, the first day of July next.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the 19th day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty and in the eleventh year of His Majesty's Reign.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, Joseph H. Pelletier, Esquire, High Sheriff of the County of Madawaska, has made a return to the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer setting forth that an election of the ratepayers of the Town of St. Leonards, in the County of Madawaska, was held on the 10th day of June, A. D. 1920, to determine whether the inhabitants thereof should be incorporated under the provisions of Chapter 166 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, intitled "The Towns Incorporation Act;" that at said election there were ninety-eight (98) votes cast in favour of incorporation, and twelve (12) votes cast against incorporation; that the boundaries of the said Town are as follows: "Bounded on the north by Lot Number 107, granted to one Henry Tardif and now occupied by one Epiphane Lapointe; on the east by the rear line of the St. John River lots; on the south by the northern or upper line of the land now occupied by Joseph Violette, being part of Lot Number 113 granted to one Andrew B. Hammond; and on the west by the St. John River."

And it appearing by said return that the majority of the ratepayers within the said bounds had voted in favour of incorporation, I do therefore proclaim that the said Town comprised within said bounds hereinbefore described, be incorporated under and by virtue of the Towns Incorporation Act, under the name of the "Town of St. Leonards."

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, this eighteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in the eleventh year of His Majesty's reign.
