## SACKVILLE HARNESS, LIMITED.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1915," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the fourteenth day of June, A. D. 1920, incorporating Aretus Charles Anderson, shipping clerk; Albert Anderson, Farmer; James Leaman Dixon, Merchant; Frank Willis Fullerton, Harness Maker; Clarence Ashley Griffin, Harness Maker, and William Walter Ward, Harness Maker, all of the Town of Sackville, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To make, manufacture, purchase, sell, job in and otherwise deal in harness, boots, shoes, larrigans, leather goods, saddlery, leather lasts, shoe counters and articles made in whole or part of leather, wood cases, shoe dressings, rubber footwear and other parts and furnishings connected with the manufacturing of footwear and all other things incidental to footwear.

To carry on a general tannery business for the purpose of tanning and curing hides, the making of all kinds of leather, the making and otherwise dealing in boots and shoes, larrigans, harness and all kinds of leather goods; to operate and carry on one or more tanneries; to buy and sell and otherwise deal in tanbark or other material necessary for tanning and curing purposes, to tan and finish leather of all classes and kinds; to buy and sell leather, to buy and sell scrap leather and products of tanning and to do all acts and things in connection with the aforesaid business.

To acquire the goodwill, plant, rights and property of any kind, and to acquire and undertake the whole or any part of the assets and liabilities of any person, firm, association or corporation having powers similar to those of this Company, and to pay for the same in cash, stock, or bonds of this corporation or otherwise.

To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value or render profitable any of the company's property or rights.
