HIS HONOUR the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to approve of the following regulations made under authority of the New Brunswick Factories Act, 1919.

Stationary Engineers.

Regulation 1.—All persons employed in the Province of New Brunswick as stationary or hoisting engineers, and all persons having charge of boilers carrying a pressure of more than fifteen pounds, must, on or before October
